During our time in Cairns, North Queensland, it was super lovely to hang out with MAF friends at Treetops Lodge, a missionary guesthouse. The guesthouse has a little swimming pool and good air-conditioning, both of which we made plenty of use of as the hot season was beginning (around 35 degrees every day). Another missionary kindly allowed us to borrow their car so we could easily drive into town to browse in shops, play at the waterfront, and enjoy the clean streets and general friendliness.

From there, we went on a six-hour train journey down the coast to Magnetic Island, where a former missionary doctor in PNG allowed us to stay in his family's holiday home for 10 stunningly sun-soaked days. We adopted one of the local beaches as 'our place' and spent many happy hours swimming, building sand forts, scrambling over boulders and playing hide-and-seek with tropical fish at the edges of

This excitement of the last month has been our aviation fuel supplier being unable to supply us any fuel. The team did an incredible job changing to fully imported fuel with only very minor disruption to service (we did use some imported fuel previously but not on the scale we are now).

We had to communicate with our customers, staff and board of directors; we had to work out supply chains for the fuel coming in including in-country barges, canoes and road transport; we had to work through the finances and how we can best maintain high impact whilst being able to afford it (imported fuel is very expensive).
