Glenn: It's been a busy year for the flight training school in Mareeba with more students enrolled on the course. This means more flying and the spin off from this is more maintenance for the hangar team to do. Some of the work is planned and other issues just crop up and have to be fixed immediately.

Pictured below is a Cessna 172 that was scheduled in for an inspection. We found (unexpectedly) that the engine mounts were worn and cracked. This required Glenn to remove the engine to replace the mountings. In November Glenn travelled to Brisbane for two weeks on an electrical exclusion course. As his licence is modular this can now be added to his licence. This will enable him to carry out small electrical tasks on the aircraft. While on the course he had the opportuni-

ty to work on larger aircraft, (picture on front page) which he enjoyed. However, he prefers smaller aircraft like what MAF uses.

The team also prepared a new C208, (pictured with Roger and Elizabeth) P2-GRA that King Charles dedicated in April which is now serving in PNG.
