As a MAF team in Uganda, we started our 2025 by giving testimony to God's faithfulness to us for many years. In our first week back in the office in January, we gathered in front of our office (and beside our aircraft!) to acknowledge together that 'Thus Far God has helped us' (1 Sam 7:12). Through many challenges and potential obstacles, we have sought to put our hope in Him alone, and He has never let us down. In fact, He's often answered our prayers in miraculous and amazing ways!So, each team member brought a stone with their name on it and laid them all together as a memorial to God's faithfulness, taking our example from Joshua 4 and 1 Samuel 7. Our memorial remains in place on our airfield as a reminder throughout 2025 that God is faithful, and He has given us this work to do together, and He will neither leave us nor forsake us in it.

We took the opportunity of a week off in March to visit Prayer Mountain in Jinja, east of Kampala. This is a beautiful Christian retreat, set on a hill above Lake Victoria and the source of the Nile. The <u>history</u> of this place is truely remarkable and miraculous, being turned from a barren wasteland used for witch doctor ceremonies into a lush green pine forest used for leadership training and retreat. This was our second visit to Prayer Mountain, and we will certainly go again. The huge glowing cross that towers over the lake every night is mesmerizing, and worth a visit all by itself, as is the singing of grace with all the other guests before every meal!

In February he visited a friend and pastor of a church in an inner city Kampala slum, with the plan to join a sports outreach session with the young men who live there. However Duncan's visit to the church that day turned into an opportunity to preach the Gospel, make an alter call for healing and salvation, following which 53 young men were transported in the back of a lorry to get baptised in Lake Victoria!
