We returned to Uganda in mid-July with an important school year ahead for Sam as he started Grade 11 (that would be 5th Year in Scotland), and a new job for

Deputy Regional Director for Africa. This role
covers the whole Africa region, and includes 8
programmes in 8 countries from Guinea and
Liberia in the West, to Madagascar in the East.
There has been change for the girls too as
Sarah completed her YWAM DTS in Australia
and joined us in Scotland for 10 days before
heading off to YWAM again, this time in
Switzerland. And Rebekah is now both the
Volunteer Coordinator at the Wild Olive Cafe in
Glasgow, and also part of a Scottish jewellery
making business called Rois Sea Glass.

The Aid Cuts reach Uganda



You will be aware that in March this year, the Trump administration in the USA cut billions of dollars in international development aid, and subsequently closed down USAid. This dramatic and swift action left the global development and humanitarian sector reeling, with millions of job cuts, whole programmes and organisations shutting down, funding for hospitals and schools gone in an instant, and important life saving medications withdrawn. In Uganda, the removal of USAid from the large humanitarian sector has been devastating - nearly 2 million refugees across 13 large settlements left with significantly reduced or no food aid, healthcare or education. The result is

increased malunitrition in children, coping mechanisms that include prostitution and child trafficking, violence, deaths and suicides, and parents who simply walk away from their families because they cant look after them any more.

In the midst of this desperate situation, some organisations are trying to do even more with less, and MAF continues to fly many of them to the remote settlements in the north and west of the country. One such organisation is Khayamandi Foundation that amongst other things, is providing **child-headed households**, such as the one in the picture above, with highly nutritious meals and practical support to enable them to thrive whilst caring for each other without a parent.



Amphibious Plane on its Way!Our new amphibious plane has landed in the Netherlands, on its way from the USA where it was being refitted and painted. It will land in Uganda in October, and then months of training and preperation begin, before we can start serving the remote communities on Lake Victoria by Q2 2026.

30 Years Together and Still Having Fun

On the 19th August, Duncan and Ruth celebrated 30 years of adventure together! We've lived on 4 very different continents, had 3 amazing children, and still enjoy the challenge and excitement everyday of walking where God leads us.
