



We had the fun experience last weekend of being asked to share a short farewell message at our church in PNG. Both of us, Fraser and Tracy, separately opted for the same passage: Chapter 14 in the Gospel of Matthew when Jesus walks on the surface of the Lake of Galilee and helps his friend Peter to do the same.

It seems a very pertinent part of the Bible for us as we prepare to step out of the MAF team based in Mount Hagen and into the new MAF team in Buka, Bougainville. We're praying that the inevitable storms/challenges will give Jesus centre stage and that our faith will not be 'little'!

## **Tracy writes:**

It's been a full-on couple of months since we last updated you; full of 'lasts', handover and packing. There are so many people and things we are sad to leave but we're also looking forward to joining the team that is setting up MAF Bougainville – so we have very mixed feelings!

Two farewell events were big highlights: Firstly, we had a farewell 'bung' (gathering) and 'mumu' (community underground BBQ) with our colleagues from MAF PNG. This involved a beautiful drive into the hills and a short but slippery hike to a BEAUTIFUL waterfall and river. The folks who live there are related to a MAF staff member, and they told us they had been wanting to share their 'hidden place' with outsiders for a long time. We were the first non-Papua New Guineans to ever set foot there! We spent a wonderful day splashing in the river, bombing into the deep pool at the bottom of the waterfall, and observing the mumu as it progressed. The whole community worked hard to heat up large stones from the river, prepare the food, wrap it in foil and banana leaves and place it on top of the hot stones in the mumu pit to cook. It was delicious! We were also given the privilege of naming the area where the mumu took place: it is now called 'Primrose Park' (after Rosie).



Primrose Park mumu: stones from the river are heated in a big fire and then put in the ground. Food is piled on top and left to slow-cook for an hour or two. Delicious!



Our second highlight was this past weekend when we farewelled our beloved 'bush house', also known as Mount Olive Fellowship Home (named after Oliver). Five other MAF families joined us and our friends, Pastor Samuel and Mary, for another delicious mumu and the chance to see what the place has to offer. We told the story of our friendship and how we feel the Lord gave us the vision to build a prayer community where Christian workers from PNG and abroad can work, rest and play together. Some folks hauled wood from the forest for the next phase of the building project; some supervised the kids playing in the waterfall; others worked with Mary to prepare food and learn the best way to mumu chicken. Five different nationalities were represented and our day together tasted like a little slice of heaven on earth!







My work role also had big highlights. Over the past several months, I had the pleasure of coaching the ten members of staff who deliver training during our induction week for new recruits. The theme of the week is 'Living Up To Our Calling' and covers safety/security, spiritual health, cultural literacy and general professionalism. It's been hugely satisfying to see these colleagues growing in confidence and skill as facilitators.

Finally, it's also been a time to de-clutter, put final dates in the diary with dear friends, and tidy up lots of loose ends. Now that this is done, we can focus on how much we're looking forward to coming to the UK for home assignment and potentially connecting with YOU!
