Christmas greetings from Kampala. It's hard to believe that another year has passed and we are celebrating Christmas again. We'd like to share a little of what's been going on here in Uganda over the past few months both in our work and in our family.

MAF helps to bring Hope and Encouragement Last week, the pastor of our church here in Kampala gave the congregation a presentation documenting his recent mission trip to South Sudan. He had joined a team from the organisation Every Village as they travelled to remote parts of South Sudan to teach at a series of pastors' conferences.

The team travelled between the different locations in South Sudan on MAF aircraft and although Pastor Martin (pictured front left) admitted that he really doesn't like flying, without MAF this kind of outreach would be extremely difficult. Andrew has been kept busy with the flying in and around Uganda with the regular mix of shuttles and charters. Last week Andrew flew some donors to Cure Children's Hospital in eastern Uganda where he joined the group on a tour of the 4 new operating theatres which are under construction. The hospital currently has 3 operating theatres and already carries out almost 2,000 surgeries per year, specialising in the treatment of conditions including hydrocephalus, spina bifida and brain tumours.

The school chaplain and counsellors have been a huge support to our school community. They have encouraged the children and staff to remember the enthusiasm of Elijah when he sang the following song, which all of our Y2 students performed at the school Uganda Independence Celebration in October. Last Saturday Liz had a special afternoon with our church Ladies Bible Study group. We enjoyed the fun-filled game, Pass the Parcel- with a difference! Each time the Christmas music stopped, the lady holding the parcel unwrapped a layer of gift-paper to uncover a card with one of the names of Jesus and a Bible reference. We looked up the reference and chatted together about what significance that particular name may have for us.



Liz was especially struck by the name "Dayspring" - a less familiar name (Luke 1:78-79 and Isaiah 9:2). Its meaning is so encouraging. Jesus is the one who, like the sunrise, reliably and beautifully shines in our lives, day after day. The Dayspring, like the rising dawn, shines guidance for each day and can bring a new dawn of hope during seasons of difficulty.

Luke 1:78-79: "Through the tender mercy of our God, with which the Dayspring from on high has visited us; To give light to those who sit in darkness and the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."
