CHILDREN'S RESOURCES



You will need:

1 piece of A4 paper per child Glue stick **Scissors** Hoop or wastepaper bin (optional)

DISCUSSION (5 MINUTES)

Set the scene for the children, telling them about MAF and explaining why we fly aircraft in different countries around the world.

Start a discussion about what it must be like for people living in isolated places, and ask the children how they could pray for them.

PAPER PLANES (15 MINUTES)

If the children are unsure about how to make paper planes, there's a helpful video on our website — www.vimeo.com/mafuk/paperplane — or see the photocopiable instructions on the other side of this sheet.


Encourage the children to decorate their planes. On the other side, you'll see some prayers they can cut out and stick on their planes. Alternatively, let them write their own prayers on the planes.
