Serving Sesia's Samburu people

'Life here is harsh,' explains Malikoi Leparmorujo, who works hard to care for her daughter and five sons. Her nearest water supply is far away — and often dirty — with drought making life for the villagers of Sesia, Kenya, harder each year.

Malikoi tends a few animals, fetches water and firewood, and ensures that her children go to school and help with the household chores.

'It isn't easy,' she says, 'but I'm thankful that today MAF brought us food.'

Our Kenya programme regularly flies missionaries and supplies to this hard-to-reach area, with MAF Pilot Ruth de Wit doing so 'to bless communities and show God's love.'

She says that 'seeing the joy on [the 44] people's faces when they receive food makes me happy.'

With the assistance of missionaries

Eddy and Amanda Simmons, MAF helped distribute enough maize flour, rice, beans, mung beans, sugar, salt and cooking oil to last a month.

Eddy and Amanda have lived among the Samburu people for seven years and are grateful to MAF for enabling them to 'keep serving here'. Amanda runs a medical clinic that sees about 100 patients a week, and Eddy shares the Gospel.

Eddy says he's observed how the Gospel transforms lives, having 'seen changes in how husbands relate to their wives and children.'

For pilot Ruth and MAF team member Carol Wangari, one of the most heartwarming moments was witnessing the ladies' joy as they chose clothes for their children.

'My hope,' Carol said, 'is that this small gesture reminded them that even in the most difficult seasons,

Christ's love is present and is powerful.'

For Malikoi, the food package means that her children will have enough to eat.

For Eddy and Amanda, MAF means they can continue to reach one of Kenya's most unreached communities.

For MAF, bringing help, hope and healing to remote, isolated and vulnerable people is what we do. It's why we exist.

Pray that, despite daily life in the remote Samburu village of Sesia being marked by long walks for water, scarce food supplies and the ceaseless struggle for community members to provide for their kids, MAF will continue to provide food and clothing whenever they're needed.
